### PRIMARY ASSIGNMENTS:

- ☐ Directed Drawing
  - Follow the step-by-step instructions, using a pencil, to draw a lion.
    - Four steps for kindergarten and first graders
    - Eight steps for second and third graders
  - Write more than one sentence about your drawing.
  - Add color and details to your illustration.
- ☐ Tell & Solve
  - Materials needed: pencil and paper per person and playing cards.
  - Player 1 flips over a card and begins a story problem using that number (i.e., If the player picks a card with a 6, they would say, "The farmer has 6 chickens")
  - Player 2 flips over a card and finishes the story using the number on the card (i.e., if the player picks a card with a 3, they would state, "The farmer bought 3 more chickens")
  - Both players solve the mathematics problem with an illustration (picture, number sentence, chart, etc.)
  - If they arrive at the same answer, they win the cards. If not, the cards go back in the stack.
  - The game ends when players have won 3 cards.
- ☐ Write a letter to Elizabeth about your family's Thanksgiving celebration.
  - Include details about your family's traditions or special time with your family
  - Use the attached line paper.
  - Include at least three sentences, using capital letters, punctuation, and space between words
  - Use the [Friendly Letter](#) format.
  - Kindergarten students may dictate a letter or draw a picture with an adult labeling or writing what the child describes in the illustration.
- ☐ Read for 20 minutes
  - Read aloud, read silently, have a family member read aloud, or listen to an audiobook.
- ☐ 1 session on Waterford Reading
- ☐ 15 minutes on i-Ready Math lesson

## INTERMEDIATE ASSIGNMENTS:

- Create a comic about your family's Thanksgiving celebration.
  - Include details about your family's traditions or special time with your family
  - Include illustrations
  - Include captions or dialogue
  - Use learned punctuation and capitalization.
  - Use known spelling patterns and correctly spell high-frequency words.
- Compare and Contrast Writing
  - Think of two very different people in your life.
  - Think of their personality, impact on your life, and looks.
  - Compare and/or contrast these two different people, including description and examples in your writing.
  - Your writing should include an introduction paragraph, body paragraphs, and a conclusion paragraph.
  - To help organize and plan your writing, use the attached graphic organizer.
  - You may either do it on lined paper or type. If you choose to type, save it as a google doc and share it with Elizabeth
  - Remember to include learned punctuation and capitalization.
  - Use known spelling patterns and correctly spell high-frequency words.

  - Choose an article on Newsela.

  - Read the article once
  - Re-read the article and highlight the important details or facts in yellow
  - Complete all the accompanying activities, such as vocabulary, quiz, and write)

- 15 minutes on i-Ready Math games

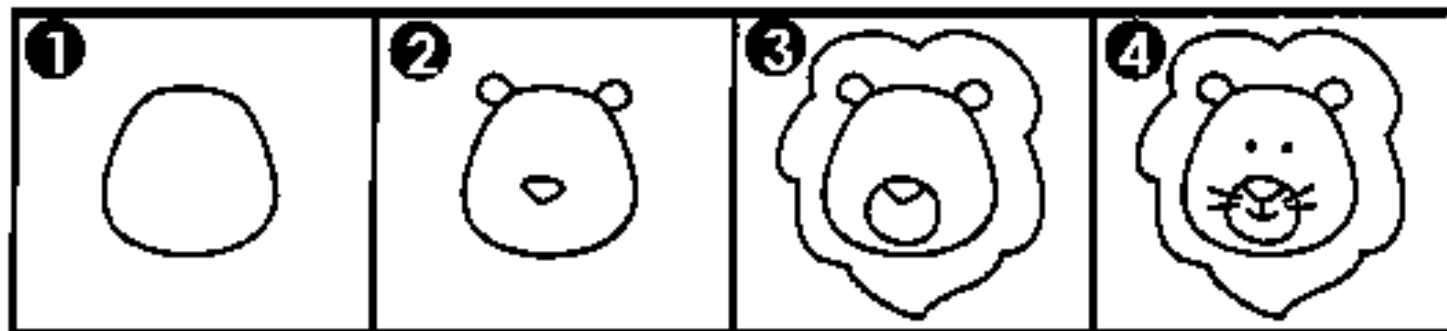
